Joint Statement on Proposed FY 2020 County Budget

The Horizon Foundation, Bicycling Advocates of Howard County and American Heart Association issued the following joint statement in response to the county executive's proposed FY 2020 budget, which includes \$2.2 million in funding, comprised of roughly \$2 million in county funds and \$200,000 in committed grants, for bicycle infrastructure projects:

We thank County Executive Calvin Ball for listening to the voices of thousands of residents as well as local businesses and civic organizations who want to see a more bikeable and walkable community. The \$2.2 million in proposed spending to advance the Bikeway and related bike routes amounts to the county's highest bike funding in years. We're shifting to a higher gear. This moves Howard County one step closer to
