## PTACHC LEGISLATIVE REPORT

## August 30, 2021

The PTA Council of Howard County seeks individuals to join the legislative committee to further the primary mission to advocate for children. The duties range from reviewing of legislation to assessing educational impact, communications, project tracking, surveying, analysis, training and more. Simply put, the effectiveness of PTACHC's efforts is directly aligned with the level of membership participation.

School Capacity-Class Size-Portable Classrooms-Concentrations of Poverty-Capital Budget-Overcrowding-Redistricting-Adequate Public Facilities Ordinance -Land Use related items. *PTA has standing positions that no school should have to operate over 100% capacity. This is a tangible issue with clear outcomes. The issue is pervasive and dominates Howard County legislative actions year after year. PTACHC is the PRIMARY advocate for this issue in the county.*

Members are strongly encouraged not only to participate in the process, but proactively ensure that the process supports adequate school resources to serve any growth without compromise to education standards. There are a series of two in person and four virtual meetings starting August 31<sup>st</sup> at 6 pm, Sept. 1<sup>st</sup> at Noon and 6 pm, Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup> at Noon, Sep 13<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm, Sept. 14<sup>th</sup> at 11:30 am (see website for details). These are the last opportunities to set direction and provide input before the plans are drafted. Once drafted any modifications will be very limited and require significant effort.

## Budget-Budget Competition-Grants-State Share-Revenues-Standards

Nearly every piece of legislation has a budgetary impact to operational and capital education funding. While the exact amount to fund any given component of education is debatable, PTA organizations need to advocate for <u>enough</u> funding to sustain the quality of education in Howard County. This may include additional advocacy to meet unfulfilled standards of education.

## **Representation – Elections – Candidates**

PTACHC does not endorse candidates but may inform its membership of legislation that may affect representation on educational issues– typically these would be informational only without a position.
