Recent items

Erikson at Limestone Valley passage – Potential traffic impacts to Clarksville, River Hill, Rt.108, affects HCPSS Board of Ed Campus and firehouse decision.

HOCO by DESIGN General Plan Update – Significant long-term impacts on growth and school resources. Final Draft pending on unspecified date – PTAs need to be prepared to participate in short notice implementation process through spring. Notable items * Education recommendations (smaller footprint, taller, cheaper - outsourced). Also density increasing items that affect enrollment growth rates and infrastructure needs.

Update – An internal memo announced the General Plan will be paused until the completion of the November 2022 elections. Advice to local units: this pause provides opportunity to address educational issues not included in the Draft. It also allows significant time for lobbying by entities that compete for educational resources. Do not take a pause yourself, take advantage of the time to learn more and promote education. There is no guarantee that the "pause" could be rescinded



Zoning Board:

OLD Courthouse Pending – possible residential. Baltimore County Flour Mill project adjacent to historic EC is going through zoning process.

Hickory Ridge - Large Capital project, large enrollment impact project – DENIED (3-2) (will most likely be resubmitted with changes)

Nov 24 – Design Advisory Panel – New Cultural Center Garage - Large capital project – educational resource competition.

Dec. 2nd Planning board – Clubhouse project - Negligible educational items





Dec. 6, 2021 – Council legislative session. Items to be decided (passed, tabled, or amended)

CB-83-2021 – Police Accountability Board – If implemented will probably review SRO/SCO operations (Tabled for a later vote)

CB-86-2021 – Timing of School Facilities Surcharge, Fee-in-Lieu and Road Excise Tax at same time. Notable that the change occurred as a council bill without special committee. Also notable that the interaction of these 3 items are being considered together, just as potential future rate adjustments could be reviewed together. (Passed Dec 6 5-0)

CR-163-2021 – Use of \$15M of fund balance – has future budget implications on HCPSS reserves. CR-166-2021 – An APFO exemption for 3 units handicapped housing. Notable more for the impact of the project or projects that shifted the obligation. – Request made to council to track sending amounts, receiving amounts and cumulative overcrowding exemptions. (Passed Dec 6 5-0)

Dec. 7, 2021 Policy 6010 update – Notable changes in participation and notice.
Analytical process mentioned, 110% "target" utilization retained in draft. External efforts to prioritize socioeconomic values as second highest priority.
MOVED TO DEC 16th 4-7PM HCPSS BOE Session – PTACHC delegates asked for form letter to submit support for 100% standard



Dec. 8, 2021 – Council monthly meeting – CANCELLED Dec 9, 2021 – Board of Appeals – CBI HOMES, Appeal School Surcharge of \$1.32 sqft Dec. 13, 2021 – Council Meeting with HCPSS BOE

Late December 2021

New pre-filed Legislation – Pending late December for January introduction, testimony and Feb vote. (Council on December break) Mid-January 2022 – Start of State Legislation session – Check progress of Statewide and Local bills **State Delegation** – Meets ONCE A YEAR on state bills that affect Howard County. These bills have been posted. Late filed bills will appear later. Public testimony is in November for bills to be passed in early 2022. PTACHC has testified on these items in public session; however, positions are pending for several of these going forward.

LR744 – HOWARD COUNTY SCHOOL REDISTRICTING PROGRAM – This is a PTACHC originated bill sponsored by Senator Hester – To fund a pilot program to bring analytical review and tools to HCPSS from Maryland State academia. This will include comparative analysis and reporting of past present and future trends. This bill is fully drafted but is currently not listed on the Delegation Site or has been scheduled for public testimony.



Howard County Board of Education School Safety Personnel Ho.Co. 1-22 By Delegate

Atterbeary (School Resource Officers Act of 2022), FOR the purpose of requiring the Howard County Board of Education to develop a plan to implement certain school safety guidelines that replaces school resource officers in public schools in Howard County with adequate law enforcement coverage provided by school coverage officers, effectively addresses the need for certain personnel, and requires school coverage officers and school security employees to complete a certain model training program; defining the term "school coverage officer"; requiring the county board to solicit and incorporate input from stakeholders in the Howard County Public School System and school community; and generally relating to school safety personnel in Howard County.

Howard County - Due Process Proceedings for Children With Disabilities - Burden of Proof,

Ho.Co. 2-22 By Senator Hester FOR the purpose of requiring the Howard County Board of Education to bear the burden of proof in due process proceedings that initiate from a due process complaint regarding the provision of special education services or a program for a child with disabilities in Howard County except under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the burden of proof in due process proceedings and the Howard County Board of Education. *Locals voted on a position to SUPPORT this legislation.

Howard County – Department of Housing and Community Development – Housing Opportunities Trust Fund, Ho.Co. 5-22 By Delegate Feldmark and Senator Guzzone FOR the purpose of establishing the Housing Opportunities Trust Fund as a non-reverting special fund to be used to promote equitable access to affordable housing for households of limited income in Howard County; requiring the Department of Housing and Community Development for Howard County to report on the activity of the Fund during the prior fiscal year on or before a certain date each year; and generally relating to funding for affordable housing in Howard County.



Howard County - Commercial Building Excise Tax - Board of Education Deferred Maintenance,

Ho.Co. 8-22 By: Delegate Atterbeary FOR the purpose of authorizing the County Council of Howard County to impose an excise tax on commercial building construction; requiring the excise tax revenue to be used only for deferred maintenance needs identified by the Howard County Board of Education; and generally relating to a commercial building excise tax in Howard County and deferred maintenance in the Howard County Public School System. *PTACHC local delegates approved support of this bill unanimously

Howard County – Public Schools – Alternative Instruction Model Policy, Ho. Co. 9-22 By: Delegate

Watson FOR the purpose of providing that the use of an alternative instruction model constitutes a certain public school being open for pupil attendance for the purposes of meeting certain school day and hour requirements; authorizing the Howard County Board of Education to adopt a policy allowing a public school in the county to use an alternative instruction model under certain circumstances; and generally relating to an alternative instruction model policy in Howard County public schools.
