

How the Pillars are Funded

- The Blueprint is funded through the State School Fund
- Divided into major aid programs
- Funded through state share and local share based on base per pupil amount shared between the state and local

County funds the greater of Required Local Share

- OR -

Prior Year's Per Pupil Maintenance of Effort (MOE) multiplied by enrollment



The amount shared between state and local is adjusted for each county's relative wealth

Revenue Changes Post Blueprint



- Required state funding is growing
- Required county funding is not growing
- Driving large above-Maintenance of Effort request
