

Should PTACHC apply for an IRS Group Exemption?

- A group exemption is non-profit status that you can confer upon others – PTACHC having a group exemption would mean it can grant non-profit status to all of the PT(S)As under its purview
- Most of the local PT(S)As are currently covered under Delaware PTA's group exemption

Should PTACHC apply for an IRS Group Exemption?

- Free State PTA has applied for their own group exemption – if it's granted, it is likely Delaware will stop allowing Maryland PT(S)As to be under their group exemption
- Instead of being under Free State PTA's group exemption, PTACHC could apply for its own
- Fun Fact! PTACHC has been dealing with a *lot* of problems for the last 3+ years relating to the transition from Maryland PTA's group exemption to Delaware PTA's

Should PTACHC apply for an IRS Group Exemption?

Pros

- ✓ PTACHC can communicate directly with the IRS if/when problems arise with local PT(S)As

Cons

- ⊘ Costs \$3,500
- ⊘ More paperwork for PTACHC
